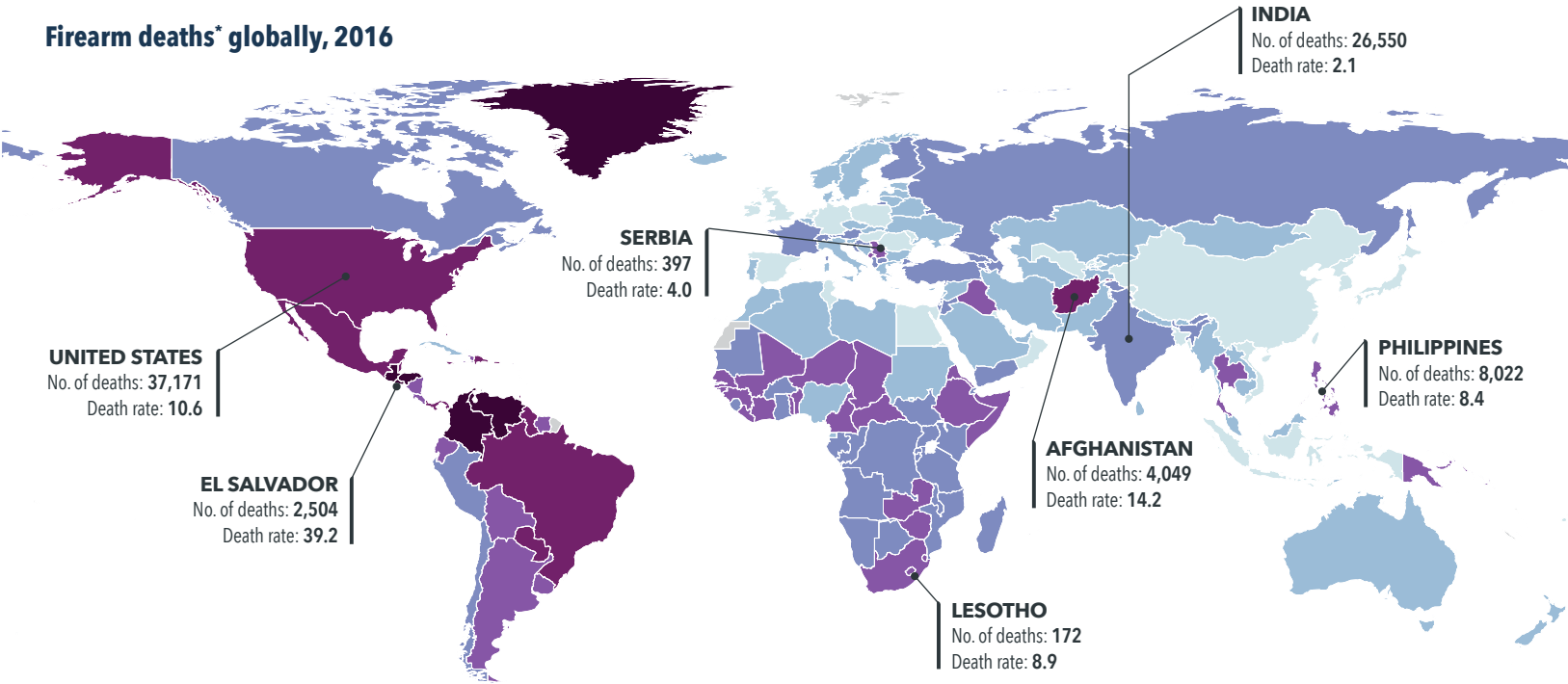


FIREARM DEATHS AROUND THE WORLD 1990-2016

Every day, **688** people die from firearm injuries around the world.

Firearm deaths* globally, 2016



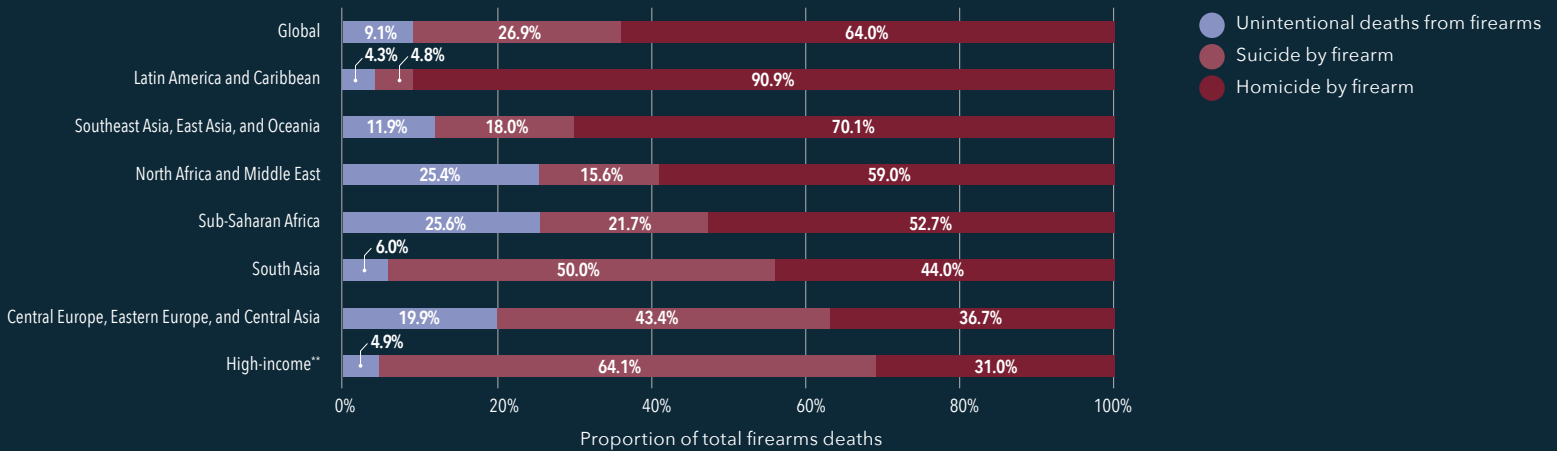
Firearm deaths per 100,000, age-adjusted



*Includes firearm homicide, firearm suicide, and unintentional firearm deaths. Countries highlighted are those with populations over 1 million in 2016 with the highest firearm-related death rates in each Global Burden of Disease super-region.

Globally, **homicide** is the most common type of firearm death, but in some regions **suicide** is more common.

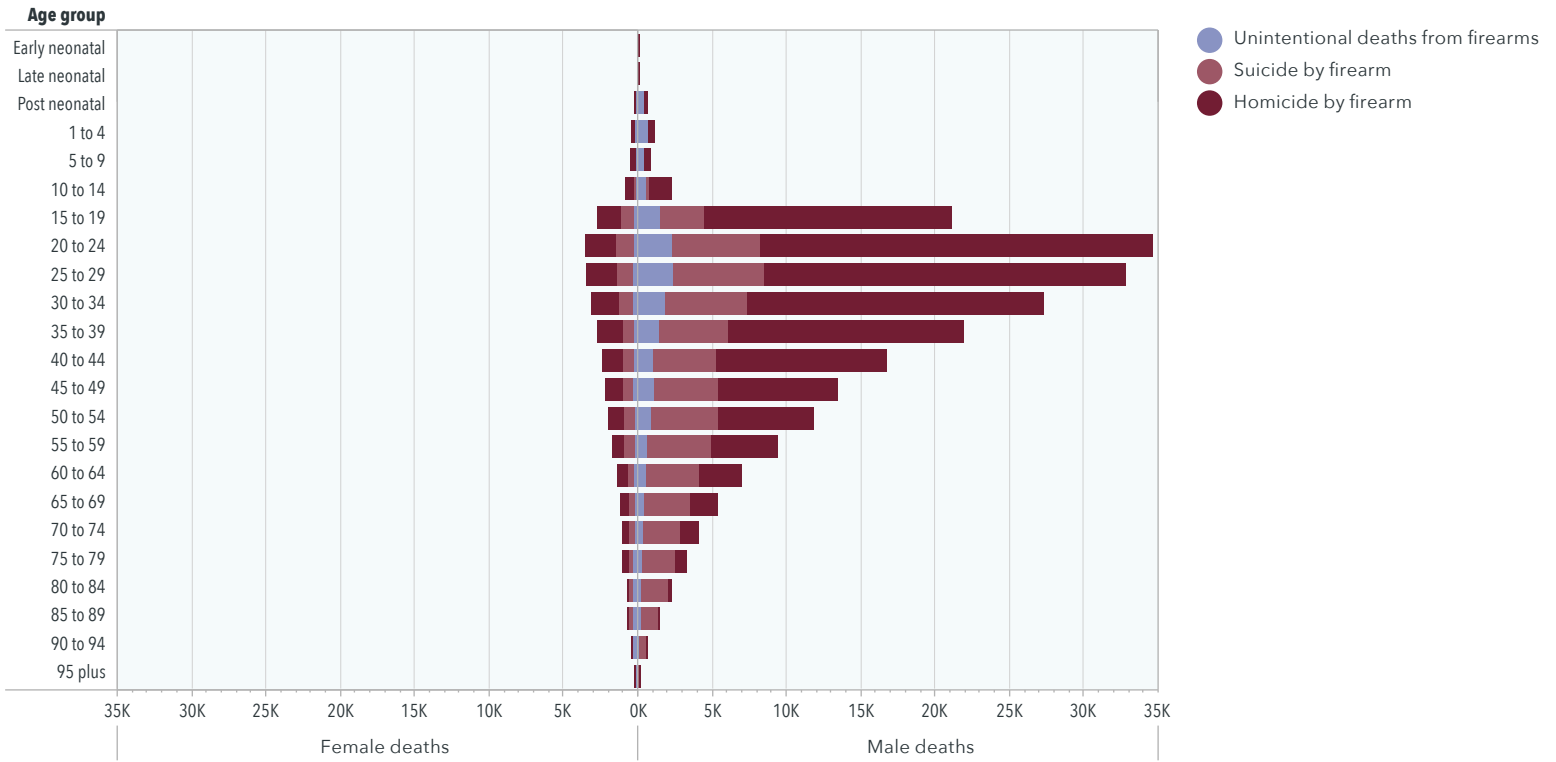
Firearm deaths by world region and cause, 2016

Most firearm deaths occur as homicides of young men.

Homicide by firearm remains high for Latin America and the Caribbean; suicide by firearm now trends slightly upward in the high-income super-region.
